



## **History of Partnership Building**


2010: Regional planning began to inform implementation of a regional Coordinated Care Organization (CCO)

 Formed Regional Healthy Communities Steering Committee to increase communication and coordination across diverse projects.

 Hired 1.0 FTE Regional Project Coordinator to facilitate steering committee and monitor implementation of joint activities and project plans.


Regional Strategic Prevention Framework

 Additional funding leveraged by IHN-CCO to hire 1.0 FTE Public Health Grants liaison position to provide grants administrative support.

 Significant media and marketing resources accessed through SHS/IHN-CCO Marketing and Public Relations Department.

# Mental Heath Promotion & Prevention (MHPP)

#### **Objectives:**

- 1. Conduct Needs Assessment
  - Build Regional Capacity and Readiness
  - Youth Engagement
- 2. Awareness/Social Media Campaign
- 3. Community Education and Training

### **Challenges to Regional Collaboration**

- Geographic and transportation barriers
- Varying geo-political environments
- Previous capacity and resources to implement primary prevention and policy work
- Different organizational cultures
- Insufficient technology infrastructure for easy and seamless communication

## **Coordination Strategies**

- Regional planning group with targeted/intervention-specific work groups
- Meeting Monthly then Quarterly
- Basecamp project management software
- IHN-CCO Coordinator on-site at counties
- Monthly IHN-CCO/Public Health cosupervision of regional coordinator

- Regional CHA Alignment Project
- Community Health Worker in primary care pilot project
- Regional Colorectal Campaign
- Linn Benton Lincoln Early Learning HUB
- Other private and public grant opportunities

### Lessons Learned & What's Next

- Don't be afraid to start with a small idea to practice new kinds of partnerships.
- Personal relationships do make a difference.
- Be transparent and invite partners to the table.
- Build in process evaluation from the beginning.
- Create safe space to address conflicts.
- Commit resources for cross-training, peer exchange and professional development.
- Ask for help and use outside technical assistance.
