



Research Question

1. How has the prevalence of marijuana use during pregnancy changed since 2016?

2. Which patient characteristics are associated with marijuana use in pregnancy?



Samaritan Health Services

- Non-profit regional health system
- 5 hospitals, 80 clinics, ~200,000 patients in 2018
- Universal screening of pregnant women
 - "5P" survey
 - Urine drug screen





Methods

- EMR data (Epic)
- Women who delivered full-term at a Samaritan hospital between 1/1/2016 - 7/31/2019
 - All received some prenatal care at a Samaritan clinic
- Timing of testing
 - Early pregnancy: <20 weeks gestational age
 - Late pregnancy: ≥20 weeks to the day before delivery
 - Delivery: ±1 day




Results

- 5,657 pregnancy episodes in 5,159 women
- 5P survey: 97.5% screened (N=5,516)
 - 77.0% screened at <20 weeks
 - 71.6% screened at ≥20 weeks
 - 27.0% screened at delivery
- Drug testing: 99.3% screened (N=5,618)
 - 72.9% screened at <20 weeks
 - 60.2% screened at ≥20 weeks
 - 92.0% screened at delivery




"Do you use marijuana for medical or recreational purposes?"






Urine tests for THC in early pregnancy






Lab results vs. self-report

Discussion

- No significant trend in prevalence of THC+ since 2016
- Strongest predictors of positive drug test after 20 wks GA:
 - Positive drug test in early pregnancy
 - Positive 5P survey response in late pregnancy
 - Medicaid coverage
 - Location (Lebanon/coast)
 - Maternal age <25
- Next steps: evaluate adverse outcomes in early childhood
